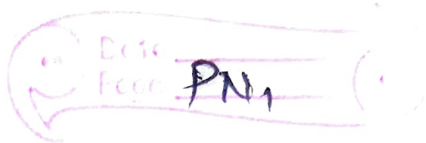


On The Pleasure of No
